



CTE Program of Study Courses available through the Texas Virtual School Network (TXVSN) – 2023-24

Career and technical education (CTE) courses are an important component to a student's education and are used to measure a graduates' preparedness for college, the workforce, or the military. Let the TXVSN help your students gain access to courses in a program of study that meets their needs. There are several different CTE courses that students can access to put them on the path to be a CTE Concentrator and CTE Completer.

Districts can receive weighted funding for students who are enrolled in these courses.

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How to get started

All participating districts must have a 2023-24 TXVSN Receiver District Agreement and Campus Activation forms on file. The agreement does not obligate a district or open-enrollment charter school to enroll a student in a course through the TXVSN. Having the signed agreement in place will expedite the course enrollment process. The district's site coordinator can register students and then enroll the students into their courses through the MyTXVSN portal.

Funding

Students who participate in the TXVSN statewide catalog courses can potentially generate Foundation School Program (FSP) funding in the same manner as a student who receives instruction in a traditional classroom.

- Part-time students could receive full-time funding by combining TXVSN courses with their schedule at their school. Each TXVSN course is considered 60 minutes of classroom instruction. If a student is enrolled in two one-hour courses at their school and takes two courses in the TXVSN, then the student would meet the full-time student status and generate FSP funding because the student is enrolled in four hours of daily instruction.
- If a student is enrolled in four or more one-hour courses at their school and takes one TXVSN course, then they will not generate any extra FSP funding since the student already met the four-hour full-time funding rule.

School districts can receive <u>weighted funding</u> for the CTE courses completed through the TXVSN statewide catalog. A student in a TXVSN course can generate funding regardless of whether the student is physically present at school while participating in the course.

Cost to the school

A student's mastery of the course will determine the cost of the course to the district.

- Successful course completion Receiver districts pay 100% of the course fee.
- Unsuccessful course completion Receiver districts pay 70% of the course fee.
- TXVSN course fees may not exceed \$400 per course. To view the exact cost of a course, please visit the statewide course catalog.
- Districts may use a variety of <u>funding sources</u> to pay for the TXVSN catalog courses.
